



TP (Young Person)

TP came to Power In Partnership (PIP) with the support of Social Care Services.

TP had left home at sixteen after a family argument and didn't feel she could return. She had engaged well at school but did not achieve any further academic qualifications as she did not attend college.

She started with PIP on a Riverside employability course and discovered she enjoyed the administrative side of the job, often assisting staff with office duties.

TP went on to complete a Business Administration Level 1 and a Business Administration Intermediate Apprenticeship based with PIP, her duties included handling the administrative side of the Halton Housing Trust Trainee (HTT) scheme. This involved ensuring that all the trainees signed-in each day, their paperwork was up-to date and they had been issued with the required PPE. TP checked timesheets, pick-up points and van details (petrol, mileage etc).

TP showed good organisational skills and had an aptitude for this type of work.

The HHT scheme enabled her to develop her abilities and skills, which has helped her to progress in her life.

Whilst on the course PIP encouraged TP to make contact with her family and after a short time attending counselling, she returned home to her parents.

TP is now living independently with her long-term boyfriend, has a beautiful baby daughter and a career to return to in reception or business administration.
