



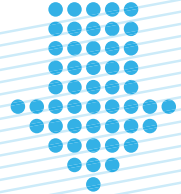

Construction is vital to delivering the infrastructure and buildings needed for the future inclusive growth of the Liverpool City Region. The sector provides a large variety of job role opportunities and scope for progression.



**Huge investments have already taken place - such as The Mersey Gateway In Halton and Paddington Village in Liverpool City Centre, and further Multi-Billion Pound developments are planned for Wirral and Liverpool Waters; Halsnead Park in Whiston, Knowsley; The new Santander HQ in Bootle, Sefton; and the forthcoming investments at Parkside, and Florida Farm, St Helens.**

# What types of jobs are available



## Architects

Architects plan and design the construction and development of buildings and land areas with regard to functional and aesthetic requirements.

Annual Pay

## Bricklayers and Masons

Bricklayers and masons erect and repair structures of stone, brick and similar materials and cut, shape and polish granite, marble, slate and other stone for building, ornamental and other purposes.

Annual Pay

## Carpenters and Joiners

Carpenters and joiners construct, erect, install and repair wooden structures and fittings used in internal and external frameworks and cut, shape, fit and assemble wood to make templates, jigs, scale models and scenic equipment for theatres.

## Chartered Surveyors

Chartered surveyors conduct surveys related to the measurement, management, valuation and development of land, natural resources, buildings, other types of property, and infrastructure such as harbours, roads and railway lines.

## Civil Engineers

Civil engineers undertake research and design, direct construction and manage the operation and maintenance of civil and mining engineering structures.

### Electricians and Electrical Fitters

Electricians and electrical fitters assemble parts in the manufacture of electrical and electronic equipment, and install, maintain, and repair electrical plant, machinery, appliances and wiring.

### Elementary Construction Occupations

These job roles involve performing a variety of general labouring and construction duties to assist building, civil engineering and related trades workers in the performance of their tasks.

### Glaziers, Window Fabricators and Fitters

These job roles involve installing pre-glazed wooden, metal or PVC framework, and cutting, fitting and setting glass in windows, doors, shop fronts, and other structural frames.

### Painters and Decorators

These job roles involve applying paint, varnish, wallpaper and other protective and decorative materials to interior and exterior walls and surfaces, paint designs on wood, glass, metal, plastics and other materials, and staining, waxing and French polishing wood surfaces by hand.

### Plumbers and Heating and Ventilating Engineers

These job roles involve assembling, installing, maintaining and repairing plumbing fixtures, heating and ventilating systems and pipes and pipeline systems in commercial, residential and industrial premises and public buildings.
