Aerobility is a registered charity founded in 1993 offering disabled people, without exception, the opportunity to fly an aeroplane. They are based at Blackbushe Airport in Hampshire. Their location makes it difficult to provide flight training on Merseyside.

To help us to find a suitable CAA approved local flying school to provide the service, we wish to seek comments, positive or negative from interested parties and organisations to establish if there is a market for the service.

The opportunities for people would be:

Experience trial flights usually lasting 1 hour.

For the more adventurous the opportunity to work towards a Private Pilot's Licence.

It is not the intention of this introduction to put costs against flights, but budgets may be in the region of £200 / £250 per hour.

The benefits for the individual would go beyond the flight experience.

Our dream would be to create an aviation community and encourage people to get involved for the benefit of others.
