



Halton's MAX Card Scheme

What is it?

The Max Card is a discount card for families of disabled children that can be used at various leisure and holiday activities across Britain. The scheme is designed to help families save money on great days out at castles, zoos, bowling alleys and more.

Halton has registered with this national scheme in the hope that some activities may be more affordable for families. Please see the website for further details:

Who can have a card?

We are offering this to families of disabled children aged 0-18 years who live in Halton. The card cannot be passed on to be used by another individual or family.

How can I get a card?

Please contact the Halton Short Breaks Service for Children with Disabilities team, you can email AimingHigh.forDisabledChildren@halton.gov.uk or call 0151 511 6560 for more information and to arrange collection of a card.

You will be asked to complete a form to provide details of your name, your child's name and date of birth and your home address including postcode to register with the scheme. The signature for the main carer is required by the Short Breaks Service when you receive your card.

There is a small fee of £2.50 for the card which covers the full cost that Halton Borough Council pays to the scheme. Payments can be made in cash on collection of the card. It is valid for 2 years and so those using the card will probably cover their costs the first time that they use it.
