Types of Provision Definitions

Resource Base Definition

The purpose of a resource base is to provide targeted educational support to children who present with special educational needs, which will enable them to make progress and achieve educational outcomes.

Resource Bases are usually attached to and are part of a mainstream school setting. They are small bases, usually with a focus on one area of additional need (such as ASC), where learners can benefit from small group sizes, enhanced staff support, a more specialised curriculum, an adapted learning environment, and staff with an enhanced level of expertise. Being placed within a mainstream setting allows access to a blended learning program that offers the opportunity to access a mainstream curriculum and classroom as well as targeted support.

Special School Definition

A special school provides education and support to children and young people with an education, health and care (EHC) plan who have complex special educational needs and require their SEN provision to be delivered in a specialist setting.

Alternative Provision

Alternative provision is education arranged by local authorities for pupils who, because of exclusion, illness or other reasons, would not otherwise receive suitable education; education arranged by schools for pupils on a fixed period exclusion; and pupils being directed by schools to off-site provision to improve their behaviour.
