

Educational Neglect

The Department for Education (DfE) has stated, 'persistent failure to send children to school, is a clear sign of neglect'.

The NSPCC has cited, educational neglect is 1 of the 4 main types of neglect (NSPCC 2023). Educational neglect refers to a parent's or carer's failure to ensure their child's educational needs are being met. Children have a legal right to an education & so failing to send the child to school regularly is an example of educational neglect.

An addendum has been made to the **Neglect Strategy** in relation to **Educational Neglect**. Guidance has been produced to support education and social care professionals, local authority services, external services, charities and key partners such as health services and Police, in discharging their statutory duties in relation to school attendance.


